The first step to fundraising is choosing an event.

There are loads of ways you can raise money for the Theatre, so get creative and find something which suits you that you'll have fun doing!

The Development Team will help you plan your event safely and follow the relevant guidelines and regulations.



# Workplace Fundraising

Organise a coffee morning, fancy dress day, sweepstake or group challenge with colleagues and your connections, with a collection for Theatre Royal Wakefield.
You might even have access to match funding from your employer, to make your donations go even further!



# **Sport Challenge**

If you're planning to compete in a race, we'd love you to collect sponsorships for the Theatre.

There are loads of events across the country on findarace.com, with a range of distances.

A sports challenge doesn't need to be competitive. Challenge yourself to cover a certain distance over a month, or do an activity every day.

#### **Get Creative**

If you have a unique skill or craft, could you sell your creations for a donation?

A cake sale always goes down a treat, or you could run your own baking contest for friends or colleagues, asking for a donation in exchange for entry.



## Give something up

If there's something you think you couldn't live without, challenge yourself to give it up for a period of time and ask for sponsorships.

Try a sponsored silence, Dry January/Sober October, or go without your phone or social media.



### **Host an Event**


Bring people together and do something you enjoy whilst also raising vital funds for the Theatre. You could host a quiz, sports day, dinner party or concert. Maybe you could put on a performance and raise money through ticket sales.



## **Celebrations**

Could you ask your loved ones to make a donation as a gift for your birthday, wedding or anniversary? Facebook birthday fundraisers are a fantastic way of asking lots of your connections to donate and are simple to set up:

Once you've decided how to raise money, it's time to tell everyone about it! Aim to tell as many people as possible about your fundraising event and make sure they have clear instructions for how to donate.

We can support you to spread the word on our website, social media and in the building. We might even be able to get the word out in the local news!

Send out direct messages and emails as well as sharing posts on social media. We can help you make posters and leaflets for your work place, too.

There are some posters, leaflets and social media templates attached to this pack for you to download and get started. We can also create some content that is personal to you once we know about your challenge.









## **Social Media Guidelines**

It is important to be careful when sharing content on social media. Here's some advice for filming or photographing yourself to promote your fundraiser and sharing the content online or with Theatre Royal Wakefield.



We'll check with you before we share your photos or videos online. We might need you or your parent/guardian to give written permission before we post your photos and videos.



Make sure you set appropriate privacy settings on your social media accounts and do not share personal details such as your address, mobile number or location.



When uploading photos of yourself and friends, make sure they are happy for you to do so. Don't post pictures of others without their consent.



Speak to the session leader if you want to take any photos or videos during one of your sessions or rehearsals at the Theatre. You must be given permission to do this.



Wear appropriate clothing, even on parts of you that you think won't be seen.



Don't film things that might reveal your exact address, school or somewhere you go regularly (e.g. a sports club or activity).



Keep yourself safe - don't share something that feels too personal, complicated or sad.

There are lots of different ways you can tell people about your fundraiser. Make sure you are using social media and digital platforms in a way that feels comfortable and enjoyable.

## **Collecting Donations**

Collect donations from your supporters by setting up a Crowdfunder. Follow the step by step or contact the Development Team to help you out.

- 1 Go to our charity page on the Crowdfunder website: crowdfunder.co.uk/p/theatre-royal-wakefield (Wakefield Theatre Trust)
- 2 Select 'fundraise for this charity'
- 3 Click 'create your fundraiser'
- 🔼 Create a Crowdfunder account or login via Facebook
- Read and agree with the terms and conditions and Fundraising Regulators guidance, then fill in your name and a short bio
- 6 Create a page for your fundraiser this is the important part! Give your fundraiser a catchy name then share your aims and story.
- 7 Include photos or a video to share more about your challenge or event
- 📯 Set a target for how much you'd like to raise
- Decide how long you want the fundraiser to run. We recommend having it live for two weeks before and after the event
- 10 Get sharing! Invite friends, family and colleagues to donate

# **Handling Cash**

It is important to be careful when handling cash donations. Here's some tips for handling cash safely. Directing your supporters to your Crowdfunder page can make things easier but we know some people will still prefer offline payment methods.

Don't leave any unsecured cash unattended

Make sure you count cash in a secure place. Where possible, two unrelated people should count and record all cash you collect.

Keep cash donations in a sealed container or collecting box. You might need to work with the Development Team to check the guidance for collecting in a public place, depending on your fundraising event.

Bank cash as soon as possible. Plan who will do this & when.

Ensure the amount of cash you have banked matches your records.

Send all money you collect to the charity (Theatre Royal Wakefield).

Children under 16 shouldn't handle or count any collected cash.

The Development Team will help you with collecting donations and following the guidelines.
